At Swiss Chinooks we consider all our dogs and their puppies as family members and work towards matching the physical and personality traits of each pup with the lifestyle of their prospective owners. It is important to clarify that you will not be able to pick a specific puppy and that the matching process is dependent on the information you provide in this puppy application. We therefore ask that you answer **ALL** the following questions sincerely and completely.

Please note the following:

1. I will not place a Swiss Chinooks puppy in a home where there is another puppy **younger than one year of age**, nor will I place two littermates in the same household. Puppies need individual attention during their first crucial year in order to grow into happy, thriving adults.
2. It is standard policy and part of the application process for you (prospective owners) to **meet a Chinook** in order to evaluate whether this is the breed for you. If you are unable to visit our home in Switzerland, you will be required to meet a Chinook owner and their dog/s wherever a possibility arises (probably the closest possible geographical location to your permanent residence).
3. By submitting this application you acknowledge and agree that this **does not guarantee** that a puppy will be placed with you. The price of a Swiss Chinooks puppy is **CHF 3,500.00** (Swiss Francs).

Swiss Chinooks requires **all puppy owners** to have their pups screened as of 2 years of age for:

- hip and elbow dysplasia (x-ray)
- CAER¹ eye tests (done by a certified veterinary ophthalmologist)

These tests require American OFA² procedures which European vets need to be made aware of when performing these examinations. The results need to be sent to the OFA database and proof of these exams will be required as well as result information. The information from these exams is **crucial to future breeding decisions** of this very rare breed of dog. OFA hip and elbow x-rays are approximately 500.00 Swiss francs and eye exams are about 100 Swiss francs.

9. BREEDING A CHINOOK

As the Chinook breed ***remains endangered***, the welfare of Swiss Chinook puppies and the Chinook breed is critically important. Therefore priority will be given to applicants who wish to help Swiss Chinooks with breeding. Conformation evaluations (testing of physical attributes, done between 3 to 5 days old and then again around 8 weeks old) and temperament testing will indicate which puppies might be ideal for breeding. Although all puppies have breeding potential, the suitability of each dog for breeding is unknown and cannot be determined until he/she passes several **health tests after the age of two**. The puppy will only be considered suitable for breeding if it is certified free of hip and elbow dysplasia and any serious hereditary eye abnormalities, conforms to the AKC Chinook Breed Standard, and shows no evidence of any of the breed health problems. Hence, prospective owners need to **agree not spay, neuter or sterilize a Swiss Chinooks pup** without the written consent of the breeder and until a determination of its suitability for breeding can be assessed.

Puppies can fly in the cabin with most airline companies (2 seats per flight are usually reserved for passengers with animals). Puppies must travel in a soft but supported pet carrier under the seat in front of you. We recommend the Sherpa Deluxe Pet Carrier (L 48 x W 30 x H 29 cm) that can be also used for transporting your puppy safely by car.

Sterilization¹:

All Swiss Chinooks pups are **required to remain intact** until after their hips, elbows and eyes have been tested. There is scientific proof of the benefits of delaying spay or neutering of a dog until after the dog's growth plates have closed. This occurs when the dogs reach their mature size, typically in Chinooks this with happen at or shortly after 18 months to **2 years of age** (the OFA exams are recommended to occur within 30 days after their 2nd birthday). If prospective owners prefer that their dog is *not able to reproduce*, and there is no medical reason to spay/neuter, Swiss Chinooks strongly recommends that the dog undergoes tubal ligation or male vasectomy², as an alternative to spaying/neutering. Both neutering and alternative sterilization have pros and cons.

¹ Surgery to make an animal unable to produce offspring.

² Female dogs: Snipping and tying of fallopian tubes as a sterilization measure that is essentially the female equivalent of male dog vasectomy but a more invasive procedure. Sex organs and hormones remain intact. Male dogs: The ducts that run from the testes to the penis are cut then tied or sealed to prevent sperm from entering into the urethra.
